Taos NM Trip February 4-9, 2024

New Mexico has so much to offer: beautiful sites, art galleries, shopping, Earthship Biotecture homes, restaurants for any taste and red sandy soil that gets into everything! Oh, and skiing! Yes, snow and wind. Seven members of the Omaha Ski Club drove out to Taos for a few days of skiing and site seeing.



We skied Monday and Tuesday. The first day was sunny and we explored the whole mountain except the steeps. Jordyn took a day of snowboard lessons and decided that skiing was much better than falling many times. We had lunch breaks at the base or at the Phoenix Grill. The skiing Thursday was interesting. 6-8 inches of fresh, windblown snow over the groomed runs slowed you down. It was better on Friday with another 2-3 inches of fresh snow to cover the groomed runs.







The Welcome Party was held at 5 Star Burgers. They had great burgers and brownies with ice cream. Other nights we enjoyed Chinese at Songs (great service, not good Chinese), Mexican at Guadalajara Grill (average food), American at Sagebrush Inn (traditional American menu, with live music and dancing nightly. The Jesse Wayne band was playing when we were there) and Italian at Mondo Italiano (great food and great service).

Wednesday, it snowed and was very windy. The lifts were on a wind hold until 11 AM. They opened for about 15 minutes, and then closed down again. By noon, the area had closed. Some of us didn't ski and returned to the hotel. We went to a couple of shops to look around.



We stayed at the Hampton Inn, which was on the south end of town. They did not have a working hot tub. After a change of rooms due to a loud blower overhead all night long and a non-working TV, we settled in. It was adequate, but we will not stay at that property again.



Some of us explored the Earthship Biotecture homes made from recyclable items. They were built into the earth and looked very different from the road. They are self-sufficient off-grid buildings that work in harmony with natural phenomena in order to reuse materials, heat and cool, generate power, collect water, treat sewage and grow food. We also went to the Rio Grande Gorge Bridge which is 656 feet above the Rio Grande River and is 1273 feet long. The views of the surrounding gorge and mountains were spectacular. It is the fifth highest bridge in the United States.

The seven of us had a good time and returned home safely. Taos is a nice mountain for 4-5 days of skiing. For those who do not ski, the town and surroundings have a lot to offer.



OMAHA SKI CLUB TRIP POLICIES

1) Trip captain is the final authority on and during the trip.

2) Club members will conduct themselves in a mature manner at all times.

3) There will be a \$28.00 charge (subject to change according to bank fees) on any returned check.

TRIP SIGN-UP, DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

4) Only members in good standing with dues currently paid to the Omaha Ski Club may sign up for a trip. Children under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the trip. A trip application for a child under the age of 19 must be signed by a parent or guardian of the child.

5) By signing up for a trip a member agrees to pay the Club the full cost of the trip applied for, subject to the provisions for timely cancellation in item #7. Each trip will have its own trip deposit and payment schedule to be set by the trip committee. A deposit is required to sign up for a trip. Failure to meet the payment schedule may result in automatic cancellation from the trip subject to the cancellation fee in item #7.

6) When a trip is full the trip captain will start a waiting list. To be placed on the waiting list a member must fill out and sign a trip application and pay the standard deposit for that trip. Waiting list members must meet the payment schedules when moving to the confirmed lists.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

7) Unless otherwise listed in individual trip information, cancellations prior to 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$50.00; cancellations less than 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$100.00 if the trip goes full, or liability for the full cost of the trip if the trip does not go full. Any cancellation fees or penalties may first be deducted from payments the member made for the trip. Medical cancellations will be reviewed by the Board for refund determination.
8) Transferring from the waiting list on one trip to a confirmed list on another trip will be done with no cancellation fee. Refusal to move from the waiting list to the confirmed list will constitute automatic cancellation subject to the cancellation fee in item #7 above.
9) If a trip is cancelled by the club, all money paid to the

club by a member for that trip will be refunded. 10) All members on the waiting list when the trip departs will receive a full refund.

11) No refunds will be made until after the trip returns.

BUS TRIPS

12) Smoking on buses is prohibited.

13) Any time the bus stops enroute to its destination, passengers leaving the bus will do so at their own risk.
14) The Omaha Ski Club will not provide alcoholic beverages for any bus trip. If any members wish to consume alcoholic beverages on the trip, they can do so at their own expense, and assume all risks and liabilities associated with such consumption.
