September 30th (Saturday) 8:00 a.m. Wish Ride #26 - Percival, Iowa

The Wish Ride is a charity bike ride to benefit the Make-A-Wish Foundation. It is not a pledge ride, but has still earned over \$105,000 since it was started in 1987. Each year several hundred riders ride the roads of SE Iowa enjoying the bright red and yellow fall colors. Apples, cider, and other refreshments are provided at several rest stops.

Starting location: The firehouse in central Percival, lowa, near I-29 exit 15, about 30 miles south of Omaha. The ride is held on local roads. 5 ride lengths available: 15, 29 and 42 miles (flat), 54 and 64 miles (hilly). You can register the day of the ride between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m, or mail in your registration.

Entry fee before September 21: \$20 including a T-shirt, \$15 without a T-shirt. Entry fee after September 21: \$25 including a T-shirt, \$15 without.

In February, I will run an inexpensive trip to Keystone Resort in order to keep in shape for the Tahoe adventure.

Additional news, in August 2013 FSA plans to run a trip to Chile. I am trying to measure the interest in a summer ski trip. If you are interested in this trip, please let me know.

Trips 2012-2013



Once again ski season is almost here! Where does the time go? I just finished getting the ski gear put away and here it is again, time to pull it out and pack it up to go again. We have some great trips planned again this year and some incentives for your participation. I hope to see all the current members and add a few new faces to the trips. I think you will appreciate all the negotiation to provide you with quality lodging and reasonable prices. The Omaha Ski Club tries to offer our members a variety of places to ski each year. I hope you will find this year's line-up attractive.

First, we take you to **Copper Mountain** for a warm-up trip in December. This trip gives you a chance to find your gear and get your ski legs. This trip will include lodging and a welcome party. Lift tickets will be additional. There are a few of us that will be able to get friends/family discounted tickets with their season passes or you can look for deals online. We will always make a stop at King Soopers on the way out.

Following the Copper trip, we take a week-long trip to **Snowmass** with FSA. We will also be teaming up with the Cornhusker Ski Club to offer a bus trip option and a shorter stay. Snowmass lift tickets will include all four mountain options (Aspen, Aspen Highlands, Buttermilk and Snowmass). The week-long trip will include four days of skiing and the mountain picnic as well as the banquet, FSA welcome party and an additional OSC welcome party! Dave Burden agreed to run this trip again this year. Thank you Dave!

Next we return to **Keystone Resort** in Summit County to keep in shape for the next great adventure. Phil will run a trip to Keystone for a fun, inexpensive trip. We will stay at the Forest Condos. This trip includes lodging and a welcome party. Lift tickets will be additional. As with the Copper Mountain trip, we will be able to get some discounted tickets in Denver or if you find specials prior to the trip, this may be an option.

Finally, we fly into Reno and travel to **North Lake Tahoe** to explore several ski areas on the North Shore of Lake Tahoe. We have asked the Cornhusker Ski Club to join us as we team up for five days of skiing at a different resort each day and seven nights lodging at the Cal Neva Resort on the North Tahoe shore. The hotel will welcome us and I have arranged a farewell dinner for us on the last evening. We have an optional sixth day of skiing available or you can do a Tahoe Cruise or any other activities that are offered. The optional day is in the middle of the stay for those who wish to relax. This will be a great trip to sample the various resorts around North Lake Tahoe including Squaw Valley, Alpine Meadows, Homewood, Sugar Bowl, Mt Rose and Diamond Peak (optional).



OMAHA SKI CLUB TRIP POLICIES

- 1) Trip captain is the final authority on and during the trip.
- 2) Club members will conduct themselves in a mature manner at all times.
- 3) There will be a \$28.00 charge on any returned check.

TRIP SIGN-UP, DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

- 4) Only members in good standing with dues currently paid to the Omaha Ski Club may sign up for a trip. Children under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the trip. A trip application for a child under the age of 19 must be signed by a parent or guardian of the child.
- 5) By signing up for a trip a member agrees to pay the Club the full cost of the trip applied for, subject to the provisions for timely cancellation in item 7). Each trip will have its own trip deposit and payment schedule to be set by the trip committee. A deposit is required to sign up for a trip. Failure to meet the payment schedule may result in automatic cancellation from the trip subject to the cancellation fee in item 7).
- 6) When a trip is full the trip captain will start a waiting list. To be placed on the waiting list a member must fill out and sign a trip application and pay the standard deposit for that trip. Waiting list members must meet the payment schedules when moving to the confirmed lists.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

- 7) Unless otherwise listed in individual trip information, cancellations prior to 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$50.00; cancellations less than 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$100.00 if the trip goes full, or liability for the full cost of the trip if the trip does not go full. Any cancellation fees or penalties may first be deducted from payments the member made for the trip. 8) Transferring from the waiting list on one trip to a confirmed list on another trip will be done with no cancellation fee. Refusal to move from the waiting list to the confirmed list will constitute automatic cancellation subject to the cancellation fee in item 7) above.
- 9) If a trip is cancelled by the club, all money paid to the club by a member for that trip will be refunded.
- 10) All members on the waiting list when the trip departs will receive a full refund.
- 11) No refunds will be made until after the trip returns.

BUS TRIPS

- 12) Smoking on buses is prohibited.
- 13) Any time the bus stops en route to its destination, passengers leaving the bus will do so at their own risk.
- 14) The Omaha Ski Club will not provide alcoholic beverages for any bus trip. If any members wish to consume alcoholic beverages on the trip, they can do so at their own expense, and assume all risks and liabilities associated with such consumption.
