Meet the Omaha Ski Club's Board of Directors...

I'm currently President of the Omaha Ski Club. I have been a member of the club since 1988. I have served on the board as VP of trips, secretary, treasurer and currently president. As President of the club, I oversee the board meetings, plan the agenda and assist others when necessary.

The first time I went skiing, I was in high school, around 1975 or 1976. I went to Mt Crescent with a group from high school. Mt Crescent, at that time, had a rope tow, a T-bar lift and a handle tow lift. The skis we rented had plate bindings. Looking back on my skiing skills back then, I wasn't very good. I would go up the hill and go straight down.

The next time I went skiing, we stayed in Georgetown CO and skied at Loveland. It was my first-time skiing on big mountain.

There were six of us from Minden on the trip. When we got back home, we practiced skiing at Trail Ridge ski area, close to Linoma beach. The six of us would go out once a year. We skied at a new area each year. We went to Keystone, Winter Park, Copper Mountain, Heavenly, Kirkwood, Squaw Valley, and Park City. Copper Mtn had lifts that were named with the letters of the alphabet. That was a long time ago!

My first ski trip with the Omaha Ski Club was a bus trip to Crested Butte. I only knew one person on the bus. This was the first Flatlands Ski Association (FSA) trip. I ran my first race course and it was the first time I had skied in three feet of deep, heavy snow! I haven't missed a Flatland's event since. Soon after that, I met Leo Wutke, another member of the club. He introduced me to bump skiing at Steamboat. He made me a better skier.

I became a ski instructor at Mt Crescent. That year, I also took my first ski lesson and did a ski racing clinic I found out that Mt Crescent is the coldest place to ski. I went to Minnesota and Wisconsin for different clinics when the high temperature reached -15°. It felt warmer there than at Mt Crescent at 10°. The moisture content makes it feel colder than the actual temperature outside.

I am currently a Ski Patroller at Mt Crescent for the past 25+ years. I am a member of the Minden Fire & Rescue since '93 and am currently employed by the city of Minden. My other full-time job is farming.

I love to ski and the steeper the better. I joined the ski club to learn to ski better, meet new friends and ski with others with better technique. I have been to over thirty areas since that first trip to Mt Crescent.

I hope you will join us on some of the trips we offer during ski season. We love to ski and have fun in the snow! Everyone is welcome to come to a Board Meeting or join us at one of the social gatherings just to meet our members and socialize.


and leg bands. Word of mouth is a great way to promote our club and joining us on a trip is a great tool.



SIGNATURE

- 1) Trip captain is the final authority on and during the trip.
- 2) Club members will conduct themselves in a mature manner at all times
- 3) There will be a \$28.00 charge on any returned check.

TRIP SIGN-UP, DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

- 4) Only members in good standing with dues currently paid to the Omaha Ski Club may sign up for a trip. Children under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the trip. A trip application for a child under the age of 19 must be signed by a parent or guardian of the child.
- 5) By signing up for a trip a member agrees to pay the Club the full cost of the trip applied for, subject to the provisions for timely cancellation in item 7). Each trip will have its own trip deposit and payment schedule to be set by the trip committee. A deposit is required to sign up for a trip. Failure to meet the payment schedule may result in automatic cancellation from the trip subject to the cancellation fee in item 7).
- 6) When a trip is full the trip captain will start a waiting list. To be placed on the waiting list a member must fill out and sign a trip application and pay the standard deposit for that trip. Waiting list members must meet the payment schedules when moving to the confirmed lists.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

- 7) Unless otherwise listed in individual trip information, cancellations prior to 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$50.00; cancellations less than 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$100.00 if the trip goes full, or liability for the full cost of the trip if the trip does not go full. Any cancellation fees or penalties may first be deducted from payments the member made for the trip.
- 8) Transferring from the waiting list on one trip to a confirmed list on another trip will be done with no cancellation fee. Refusal to move from the waiting list to the confirmed list will constitute automatic cancellation subject to the cancellation fee in item 7)above.
- 9) If a trip is cancelled by the club, all money paid to the club by a member for that trip will be refunded.
- 10) All members on the waiting list when the trip departs will receive a full refund.
- 11) No refunds will be made until after the trip returns.

BUS TRIPS

- 12) Smoking on buses is prohibited.
- 13) Any time the bus stops en route to its destination, passengers leaving the bus will do so at their own risk.
- 14) The Omaha Ski Club will not provide alcoholic beverages for any bus trip. If any members wish to consume alcoholic beverages on the trip, they can do so at their own expense, and assume all risks and liabilities associated with such consumption.
